

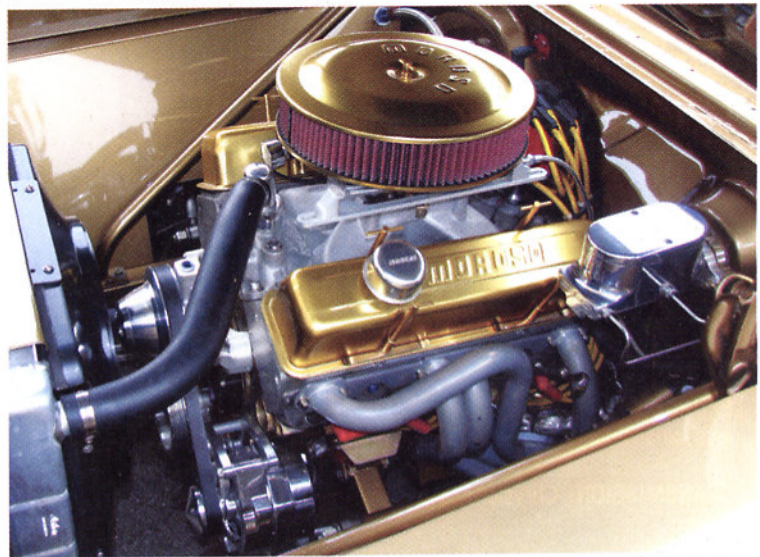


Chevy II traded for gold

Ontario's Stan McLean traded his 1967 Chevy II drag car for this beautiful gold 1967 Acadian 2 door post. Here's what he has to say. "After drag racing for several years with the '67 Chevy II, I traded it for the '67 Acadian in 1992. Since then I have been taking it to cruises, car shows and the occasional romp at the drag strip. Best ET was 11.95@114 with the old engine at around 425 HP in the Acadian.

"Over the last three years I did a major overhaul on many parts of the car. Heidt's front clip, rebuilt the 350. The only thing I kept from the first engine was the crank and block. Now it has H-beam rods, 11-1 Mahle pistons, aluminum ported and polished heads, solid roller (0.630 lift/255 degrees duration) cam, Victor Jr. intake and a Holley 750 Double pumper. The engine builder estimates around 540hp. Transmission is a Turbo 350/reverse valve body and 3,800 stall convertor. Rear end is a slightly narrowed 12 bolt with Moser axles, c-clip eliminator and 3.73 gears. As you can tell I didn't build it to run long distance on the highway, but it sure is a hoot driving around locally. One day I get it back to the drag strip.
